Protect yourself by using these cybersecurity best practices:



Choose **strong** passwords.



Use multifactor authentication.



Regularly **back up data**.



Keep software and applications **up to date**.



Lock devices when unattended.



Avoid giving out personal information online or over the phone.



Be aware of different types of phishing methods, such as vishing, smishing and spear-phishing.



Be wary of emails from unknown senders and verify that messages are from a trusted source before opening links or downloading files.
